My name is Kaleo Correa and I am an organic farmer and PhD candidate in Educational Foundations at UH Manoa. My dissertation combines my interests in land, community, and education in a 2-year case study documenting the power of gardening education to cultivate environmental literacy, inspire personal growth, and build community in Hilo, Hawaii. The international non-profit organization, Slow Food, recently acknowledged my work by selecting me as a delegate to represent Hawaii and the

U.S. at Terra Madre this October 2012. Terra Madre is an international conference that takes place biannually in Turin, Italy where delegates from 160 countries around the world are invited to share their work in a global food forum. Attending Terra Madre will give me the opportunity to share my research, to gain a global understanding and appreciation for related work, and to meet internationally recognized educators, farmers, and non-profit leaders. As someone who has lived in Hawaii all my life, I am excited to travel to a new part of the world and participate in an international dialog centered on the future of food. The experience will surely deepen my commitment to food and sustainability education. Attending this important, world meeting would not be possible without a GSO travel grant. I am deeply grateful to the U.H. graduate student organization for making this trip possible and thereby investing in my professional development.
